In Depth Discussion:  Task Force on Improving Access to Psychiatric Care	<ul> <li>Request from Honolulu County Medical Society for recs for resources for MDs to target burnout. Organizations providing EAP services.</li> <li>Dr. Smith suggested that MDs often benefit from psychotherapy; possibly publish a list of HPMA members interested in that population.</li> <li>Bruno Lima award open for nominations: for outstanding contributions in the care and understanding of victims of disaster.</li> <li>Annual gathering for members. Suggested to be held June 24-25.</li> <li>Distinguished Fellows candidates list from APA was sent to HPMA. Nominations to be submitted by June 1.</li> <li>Ka'u trip: focused on drug use and domestic violence. Met with APRN on collaborative care.</li> <li>Dr. Aulwes brought up a community request from the meeting in Ka'u, for general Q&amp;A teleconference sessions for the community. Suggestion was to set up 1 hour per month to address this community request. Executive council members each agreed to volunteer for a slot.</li> <li>Ka'u has telehealth HMSA kiosk for next year.</li> <li>Discussion was held about technology for telehealth, e.g. cell phones and computers, which allows patients to dial in from home, and to see them in their home environment.</li> <li>QCIPN: working on collaborative care, but reportedly new child psych providers will not be hired immediately.</li> <li>Behavioral health workforce meeting:         <ul> <li>Dr. Akaka reported: Working to have HPMA members sit on a governor's council for telehealth, including Dr. Smith.</li> <li>Dr. Smith: collaborative care and training for paraprofessionals each had significant support at the meeting.</li> <li>Overall sense that ideas supported by HPMA are</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Dr. Aulwes to coordinate annual gathering  Dr. Smith will send out inquiries to candidates for Distinguished Fellows asking for interest in candidacy.
